SECOND ROUND OF CONCLAVE OF RSETI DIRECTORS

In terms of the MoRD guidelines, the Conclave of RSETI Directors should be organized by the sponsoring Banks as an annual event. This is to ensure that all the gaps identified in the functioning of the RSETIs during the Conclave are addressed so that they perform on an equal footing with the best-performing RUDSETI in the country. While the first round of the Conclave focused on capacity building of the RSETI Directors and review of the RSETIs, the second and subsequent rounds of the Conclave will focus exclusively on thorough review of the performance of each RSETI by Chief Project Co-ordinator from the Monitoring Cell for RSETIs, wherein the gaps in the functioning of the individual RSETIs are identified and on-the-spot suggestions are provided to bridge the gaps.

Taking the MoRD guidelines as a starting point to organize a 2-day Conclave of their RSETI Directors as an annual event, **Bank of Baroda**, as in the previous year, took the lead in organizing the 2nd round of Conclave for their RSETI Directors on 7th and 8th September 2012 at their Staff Training College, Ahmedabad. During this quarter, **Punjab National Bank, Canara Bank and Dena Bank** also took the initiative in organizing 2nd round of Conclave for their RSETI Directors.

A summary of the Conclaves arranged by all the above Banks during the reporting quarter is as follows:

Conclave of RSETI Directors of Punjab National Bank



A 2-day Conclave of RSETI Directors of Punjab National Bank was held on **6th and 7th November 2012** at the Bank's Staff Central College, New Delhi. The programme was inaugurated by **Sri S. R. Bansal, Executive Director of Punjab National Bank**. Sri I. S. Phogat, General Manager, Sri K. N. Janardhana, Chief Project

Co-ordinator, Monitoring Cell for RSETIs and other officials from the Bank participated in the inaugural session. In his inaugural address, Sri S. R. BEAUTY OF SELF EMPLOYMENT

A Success Story from INDSETI, Puducherry

The beauty of self-employment is that any person whether male or female of any age can take up this activity at any time



during his or her life time provided there is the much needed drive from within to find ways for earning a livelihood. This drive to take up self employment activity is born out of self motivation, may be because of the circumstances one is placed in his life time.

The story of Mrs Selvi runs on the similar lines. Married at a young age to a labourer working in a Fishing Company, Mrs Selvi was not aware what the life is going to be. In the initial days of marriage, she had beautiful dreams of becoming a mother of two children but she did not realize what challenges she had to face after she begets children. Mrs Selvi, after she became the mother of two children wanted the beauty of life to continue forever, but the income level of her husband was such that to run a decent life was becoming difficult day by day as the family needs grew with the children growing.

The drive within her was so strong that she decided to face the challenges in life. Thus she searched for opportunities to see whether she too can contribute to family income by taking up some activity. At this juncture, one of her neighbors suggested Selvi to take some training in **INDSETI, Puducherry**. This suggestion was something new for Mrs Selvi. Having studied only up to 8th standard, she had her own apprehensions whether anybody will welcome her for a training. **"Anyway let me try my luck"**, she said to herself and went to **INDSETI, Puducherry** along with her husband.

She met the Director, expressed her desire to earn something for the family sake and requested for a suitable training. On questioning by the Director about her area of interest, Mrs Selvi without mincing words said "I always want to look beautiful and I also want my life to be beautiful". The Director was pleased with her candid opinion and asked whether a training in "Beauty Parlour Management" will help her. In no moment, "Mrs Selvi said, I will be too happy if you give me that training so that I can start some activity in my own house where there is some space".

Thus Mrs Selvi got into training in **Beauty Parlour Management**. During the training, it was a pleasant experience for Mrs Selvi to learn not only the skills of beauty parlour but also skills to beautify oneself with a positive attitude. The 30-day training was something amazing for Mrs Selvi that it motivated her to take up the activity without wasting any time. With a humble capital of Rs. 25,000/- borrowed from her relatives, Mrs Selvi started a parlour in a humble way in a small room lying vacant in her house. The quality of skill and her quality of service to the customers, all that was learnt during her training at **INDSETI, Puducherry** helped Mrs Selvi to get more and more customers to her fold.

As the days passed, the business grew and Mrs Selvi became a proud owner of **SUBIKSHA BEAUTY PARLOUR in Puducherry** earning nearly Rs. 15,000/- per month. Today, Mrs Selvi's house is more popularly known in the neighborhood as Beautician's house.

Asked about her reaction to the training she had from **INDSETI, Puducherry**, Mrs Selvi says, "my life is very beautiful now and I owe my gratitude to **INDSETI, Puducherry**".

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT THROUGH ENTREPRENEURSHIP **A Success Story from Bank of India RSETI, Sindhudurg,** **Maharashtra State**

Karli Parule is a tiny village situated in a remote corner in Sindhudurg District of Maharashtra State. The village is in a backward area and the people here are mainly working as



agricultural labourers. A few women working as agricultural labourers had joined a Self Help Group and started saving some money out of the wages earned by them. After mobilizing some amount of money, an idea to take up some self-employment activity came up in the minds of some group members. This issue was discussed in the monthly meeting of the SHG and the question before them was "what kind of activity to start with?" At this juncture, one of the group members suggested that coconut trees being abundantly found in the area, the group can think of taking up manufacturing few Jute products out of the coir taken out of coconut shells. All the members lauded the idea and they approached an agency which gave them the training in manufacturing coir products and also assured that it would purchase the products produced by these SHG members.

With the training received from the agency, the group members enthusiastically manufactured varieties of coir products like Bags, Door Mats, Vessel cleaning brushes, etc., but when they approached the agency for sale of these products, the rates quoted by the agency were so low that the members were not able to meet even the raw material cost. Thus, the project failed and the members were back at the agricultural fields working as labourers again.

With the persistence level being very high, especially among women, these SHG members did not want to continue as labourers for ever. Though the group had suffered a setback in its maiden venture i.e. manufacturing coir products, the enthusiasm among the members never faded and they repeatedly discussed their desire to take up some self employment activity. In the meeting, one of the members suggested to explore the trainings offered by **RSETI, Sindhudurg** as she had gathered some information about the **RSETI, Sindhudurg** to find out whether any training would help them to go ahead with their desire to take up some self employment activity. After listening to the SHG members, the **RSETI** Director suggested that the group members can take up "Fruit Processing" activity considering that various fruits like Jack fruit, mango, Amla, etc., are richly grown in the village. All the members agreed to this suggestion and enrolled themselves for a 10-day training on "Fruit Processing".

The training programme was a refreshing experience for the SHG members since they were also given information on entrepreneurial competencies, marketing skills, customer behavior etc. which made them not only to learn the various aspects relating to

entrepreneurship but also understand why they failed in their maiden venture. The skills imparted during the training coupled with EDP inputs doubled the enthusiasm of the SHG members and they unanimously decided to start a "Fruit Processing" unit in their village with the humble capital already available with them in their SHG.

All the group members actively involved themselves in manufacturing wafers from Jackfruit, varieties of juices like Mango, Amla etc. and when the season of these fruits was over, they started preparing other condiments which the group members had learnt during the training programme at RSETI, Sindhudurg. The marketing skills learnt during the training programme came to their aid and all the members do sell their products at nearby taluks during weekly bazaars where they have ample demand for their products. Four days in a week, these SHG members are busy marketing their products and during the other three days, they collaborate to prepare the food products for the village bazaars.

Each member in the group on an average earns Rs. 5,000/- per month. This has motivated their neighbors to think of undergoing a similar training at RSETI, Sindhudurg, so that they too can make their life self sufficient by way of taking up self employment.

A HUMBLE BEGINNING OF A SMALL FARMER

A Success Story from Union RSETI, Mau, Uttar Pradesh



Every small farmer has a tale of cheerless story to narrate. With only a small holding, with the unpredictable vagaries of nature and with the high cost of inputs, the fate of a small farmer looks very bleak. Thus every small farmer looks for an alternate source of income and the only way available to him is to work as an agricultural labour. But this is not so in the case of Mr Man Singh Maurya. Mr Maurya, a graduate in Arts, comes from an agricultural family which owns only two acres of land to cultivate. The income generated out of this two-acre land was so meager that it was not sufficient to feed the family of five members.

With a degree in his hand, Mr Man Singh Maurya thought it more appropriate to go for some wage employment. He thus started searching for a suitable job, but to his dismay he could not find any job to suit his graduation degree. The next alternative for Mr Maurya was to take up some self employment activity. At this point of time, one of his friends advised Mr Maurya to approach **RSETI, Mau** where varieties of training programmes on self employment activities are imparted free of cost. Mr Maurya, encouraged by this suggestion, approached the Director of RSETI, Mau, who, after careful listening to Mr. Maurya advised him to take up a course on Poultry Farming, which he can do on a small scale in the two acres of land owned by their family members. The suggestion of the RSETI Director indeed came as a pleasant surprise to Mr Maurya since he

had never thought of this allied agricultural activity, which he can do in the small agricultural land owned by him. What he needed was only good training and some capital to pursue this activity. Thus Mr. Maurya thought it more appropriate to pursue Poultry farming and enrolled his name for the training programme.

The training programme on Poultry Farming was for seven days. The inputs given by RSETI, Mau on Poultry farming in addition to soft skills such as entrepreneurial competencies, marketing, communication skills and customer management during this short period enriched the knowledge and enhanced the confidence of Mr Maurya.

Armed with training and enhanced confidence level, the challenge before Mr Maurya was to arrange funds for starting the unit in his land. He again approached the RSETI Director who helped him to secure a loan of Rs. 2.00 lakh from Gomti Gramin Bank, Pithval, Mau to start a poultry unit.

Today, Mr. Man Singh Maurya is a happy man with an average monthly income of Rs. 15,000/- which he earns by selling chicks and eggs in the local market. When asked about his experience with RSETI, Mau, Mr Man Singh Maurya says with pride "RSETI, Mau gave me the training, helped me in getting the loan, taught me the techniques of marketing and has made my life happier".
